

Follow Up and Consequences

Consequences will be applied in a fair and consistent manner, respecting individual rights, responsibilities, age and maturity, specific educational needs; and be restorative rather than punitive in nature.

Inappropriate behaviour typically has the following consequences:

- * A discussion of what has taken place and a review of expectations - teacher/principal
- * A time out to reflect on behavior - in class and/or in the office
- * An opportunity to fix the issue if applicable
- * An opportunity to practice the expected behaviour with guidance
- * A phone call home to inform parents
- * Possible loss of privileges
- * Meeting with parents and school staff
- * For physical aggression with intent to harm, child is sent home
- * Possible suspension

Consequences of unacceptable behavior will take into account student's age, maturity and special needs if any. Special considerations may apply to students with special needs if these students are unable to comply with expectations due to a disability.
